

Strengthening Family Ties by Creating Your Own Traditions

Comfort

If you do this:

- Share songs, rhymes and lullabies with your infant, toddler or preschooler that you remember from your own childhood
- Turn mealtimes into special events such as weekend breakfasts, annual family picnics or barbeques

Your child will:

- Learn words and melodies through loving interactions with you that he will enjoy hearing and repeating again and again
- Look forward to these moments as a predictable part of a routine where she can share stories and favourite foods with her family



Play

If you do this:

- Make time in your busy schedule to enjoy various activities like games, movies, walks and visits to the library with your child
- Use craft materials to make decorations that can become a special part of your family's celebrations from year to year

Your child will:

- Enjoy relaxing and having fun with you as his sense of being part of his family and part of his community grows and grows
- Build confidence in her developing fine motor skills (e.g., cutting and drawing) while adding something she made to a memorable event









- Ask family members from each generation, or who live in another country, to show pictures, tell stories and share special memories with your child (e.g., scanned photos, e-mails and tape recorded stories are gifts that will be treasured)
- Talk about your beliefs and values to encourage your child's understanding of the traditions that are most meaningful to you

Your child will:

- Discover her roots and learn about different cultures as she receives and explores a variety of information about who her relatives are, where they live and what makes them unique
- Find out what is important to his family by listening, asking questions and sharing his thoughts on what the traditions mean to him



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
